



From the Courtroom to the Classroom

Judges/Attorneys — Preparing for Your Visits

1. The contact person on your team should get in touch with your teacher to get proposed dates for your first visit. Judges may have morning calendars, so you might want to get a few time slots for your team to choose from.

Remind your teacher that CRF has some lessons on its website for her/him to use to prepare students for the first visit.

2. Work with the judge and attorney on your team to choose the best date and confirm the date/time with the teacher. Also confirm:
 - audio-visual equipment needs (laptop, PowerPoint projector, extension cord, etc.);
 - number of students;
 - that the teacher will use the introductory PowerPoint lesson prior to your visit so you can build upon the information covered.

You might let the teacher know that your team may need his/her assistance in getting the students into groups and classroom management during group work.
